Out of these, 10,589 data sets have been sent to the Circle Offices for verification, and they have successfully verified 10,589 nos. However, there are still 9,452 data sets awaiting verification by the Circle Offices. On a positive note, the DAO has approved 6,924 registered beneficiaries. b) Paddy Procurement: The DAO has informed that the procurement of Paddy for KMS 2023-24 has already been notified by the Government, effective from December 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024. It was also mentioned that the Government has allocated a target of 16,000 MT, and the DAO provided details of the target allocation for each PPC, including Baganpara PPC with 5,000 MT, Bhotepowabari PPC with 2,000 MT, Nikashi PPC with 2,000 MT, Nikashi PPC with 2,000 MT, Nikashi PPC with 3,000 MT. c) PMFBY: The DAO has announced that the Government will be providing insurance coverage for five crops, namely Summer Paddy, Mustard, Potatoes, and Maize, under the PM-FBY program.
